From January 24 through February 2, esteemed art and antiques fair <u>The Winter Show</u> returns to New York's Park Avenue Armory for its 71st edition. "I am always so excited for The Winter Show because the quality of the works shown there and the range of time periods, styles, and places of origin is truly staggering," says AD100 designer Adam Charlap Hyman, whom we've asked to cull through the show's 70-plus exhibitors to share the pieces he's eyeing this season. "I always learn something and come away feeling immensely inspired by the show, and as an interior designer I find it quite useful to see a consolidation of such incredible pieces to potentially show my clients," he adds. "Tom Wesselmann is one of my favorite artists. This enormous oil on wood and formica construction of a smoking cigarette is quintessential, and I keep picturing it over a fireplace mantle. I love seeing pictures of Wesselmanns installed in more formal interiors from the 1960s and 1970s, where they are at their most "pop" odds with the decor," Charlap Hyman says.
